

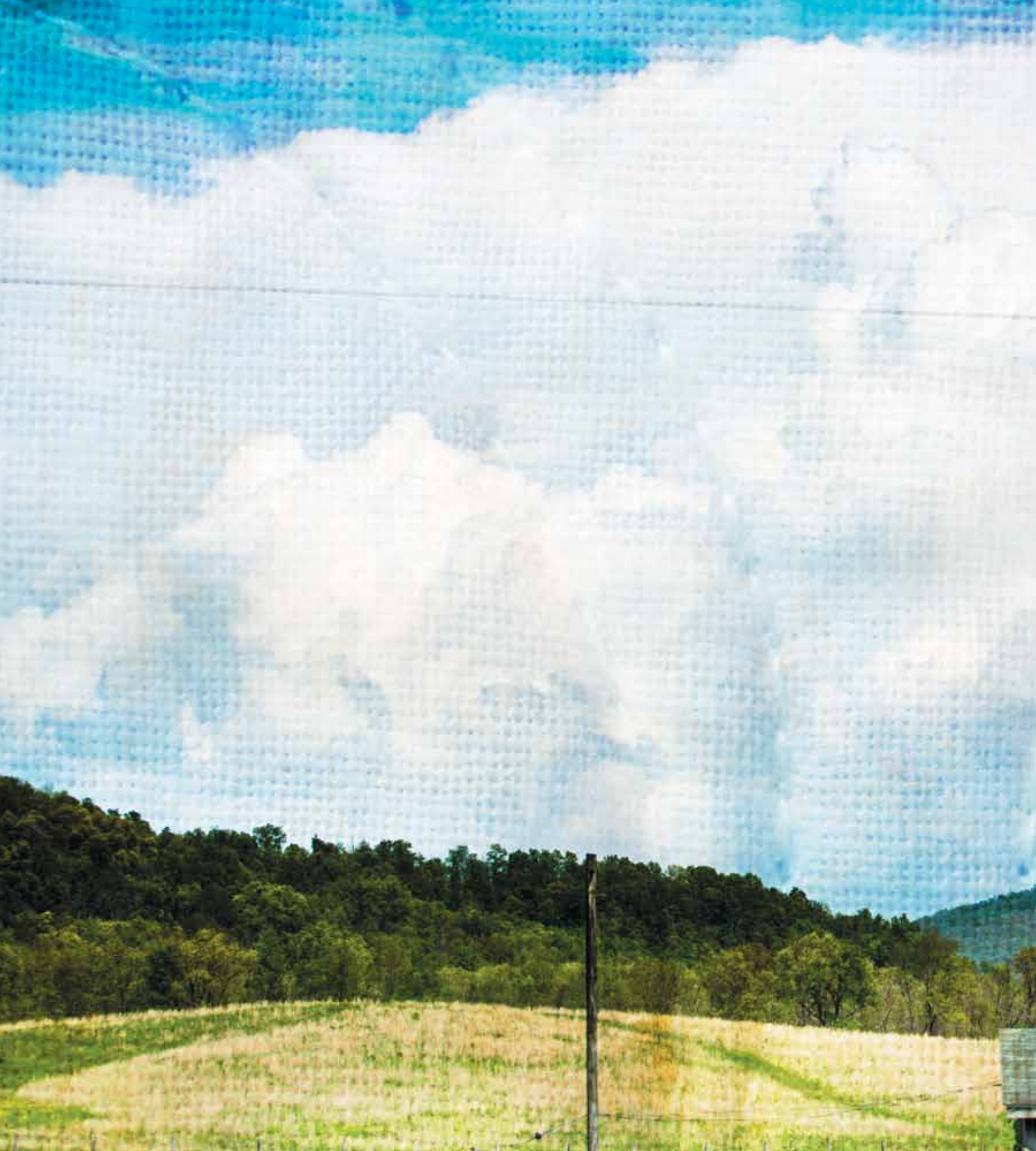

TUCKER COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

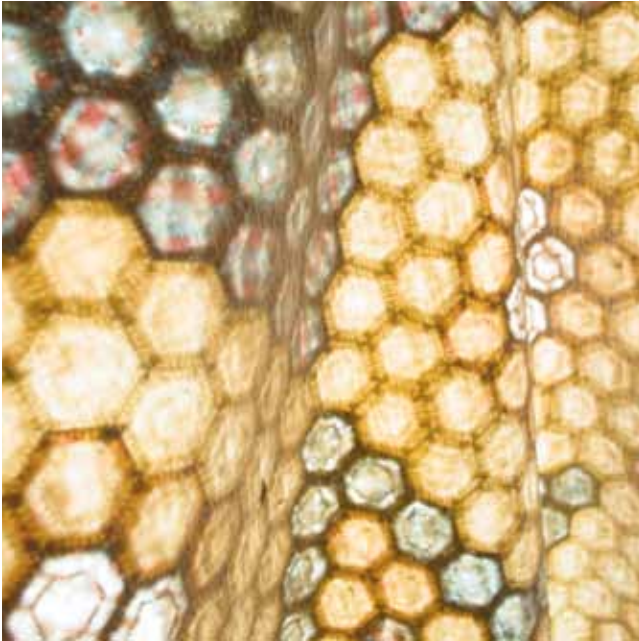

Quilts move and quilts connect over time and distance.

Quilts are rich in history and metaphor. A quilt that at first connects two people, the quilter and its recipient, can go on to outlive those two and serve generations of people in its humble duty of warmth and comfort.

The history is tactile and visible: the materials and techniques available when it was made; the skill and imagination of the quilter; the patina that comes from years of use; the wear; the raveling; certain fabrics that don't last; stains and tears; sun-fade. Even beds can impress their shape upon a long-worn quilt.

It has been twenty-five years since we started patching our quilt together; roughing out a vision of a philanthropic, community-building organization. Looking back over the folds, we see the inspiration of several individuals and their response to a single, catalyzing event – the flood of 1985.



We began our quilt in 1989 – the Tucker Community Foundation. In 1990, we distributed \$1,000. Since then our areas of interest and influence have grown to cover eight counties, seven in West Virginia and 1 in Maryland. In 2013, we distributed over \$1 million to area projects and causes.

Sometimes quilters don't have enough material for a given pattern. Lavera Kelly, 89 of Leadmine, WV, a notable quilter in her own right, has a quilt made by her great-grandmother Mary Hopkins, of Shafer (now Shaffertown). If you look carefully [see cover] one square isn't square. By careful work, Hopkins pieced in similar fabric with such skill and tact that the patch all but disappears. Now, the well-made quilt flaps gently in the breeze over Rachel Hile, a few miles and seven generations down the road.

The Foundation exists as a resource for the skilled, the passionate, and the motivated. We aim to strengthen the common threads of our social fabric. By investing in our community, we can supplement the available materials to make the difference between a pile of fabric and a finished quilt.

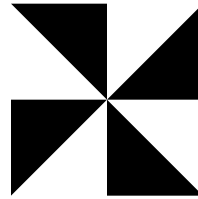

TOP RIGHT:

This 160 year-old *Multi-Star Hexagonal quilt* hangs in the living room of Barbara & Scott Weaner's home near Moore, WV. The quilt was made in North Carolina by an unknown quilter and given to Barbara from Mrs. Cleo Shotwell in 1977. It was hand-stitched circa 1862 with newspaper backing, a technique called *pierced paper quilting* in order to create the sharp, precise patterns.

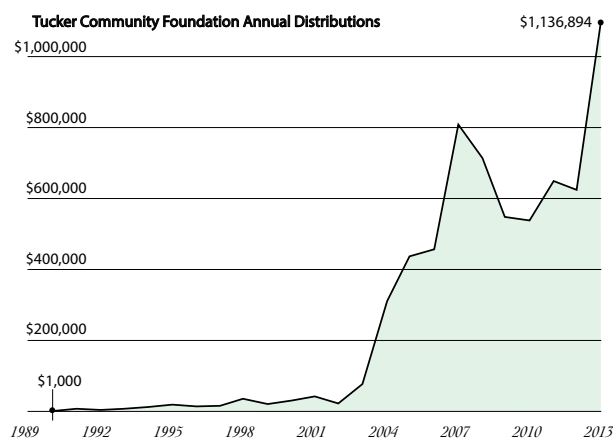

Grant awards are often supplemented with UNRESTRICTED FUNDS.

ENDOWED FUNDS are invested for growth and income. Each grant fund must reach a minimum of \$10,000 before it begins to generate an annual award; scholarship funds must reach a minimum of \$20,000.

Over 25 years, based on 9% growth and 5% annual distribution, the total market value of a \$10,000 fund will grow to \$22,157 with accumulated distributions of \$19,870.



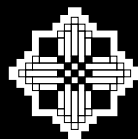

The Tucker Boulder Park Project

The Tucker Boulder Park project will provide an outdoor recreation venue for climbers of all ages and skill levels.

The collaborative project grew from informal conversations that led to organized meetings with property owners, local and county officials and other interested parties.

The meetings, facilitated by the Foundation, resulted in the Town of Davis offering a site for the park – the south east corner of the Davis Ball Park. Western Pocahontas Properties agreed to allow a new section of non-motorized trail connecting the Boulder Park, across Rt. 93 to the proposed Rail to Trail project, contingent upon completion of the Boulder Park. Heart of the Highlands offered in-kind support to construct the trail.

The community enhancement project will also raise awareness and support to build an endowed fund for Tucker County Emergency Medical Services, an organization that will be directly impacted by the arrival of Corridor H.

Grant support and donations from the general public are funding the project.

From the very beginning only 250 tickets were printed, 249 sold and one reserved to auction at the height of the event. From the very beginning the jackpot was \$5000. From the very beginning all board members were asked to sell, sell, and sell. From the very beginning Canaan Valley Resort was home to Uncle Sam's Birthday Party. From the very beginning the event has been a night of fun and laughter that brings folks back year after year. From the very beginning the "party" has introduced the work of the Foundation to a captive audience.

Serving as the master of ceremony for eleven years Tom ensured that every year the event grew with more door prizes, more raffles, more fun... and better fund raising results. Thanks to board members Amy Barb, David Cooper and Kelly Stadelman, the tradition continues and the event continues to grow. This year Uncle Sam will celebrate his birthday in grand fashion. For the 25 year anniversary the Foundation will be giving away more than \$25,000 in money and prizes.

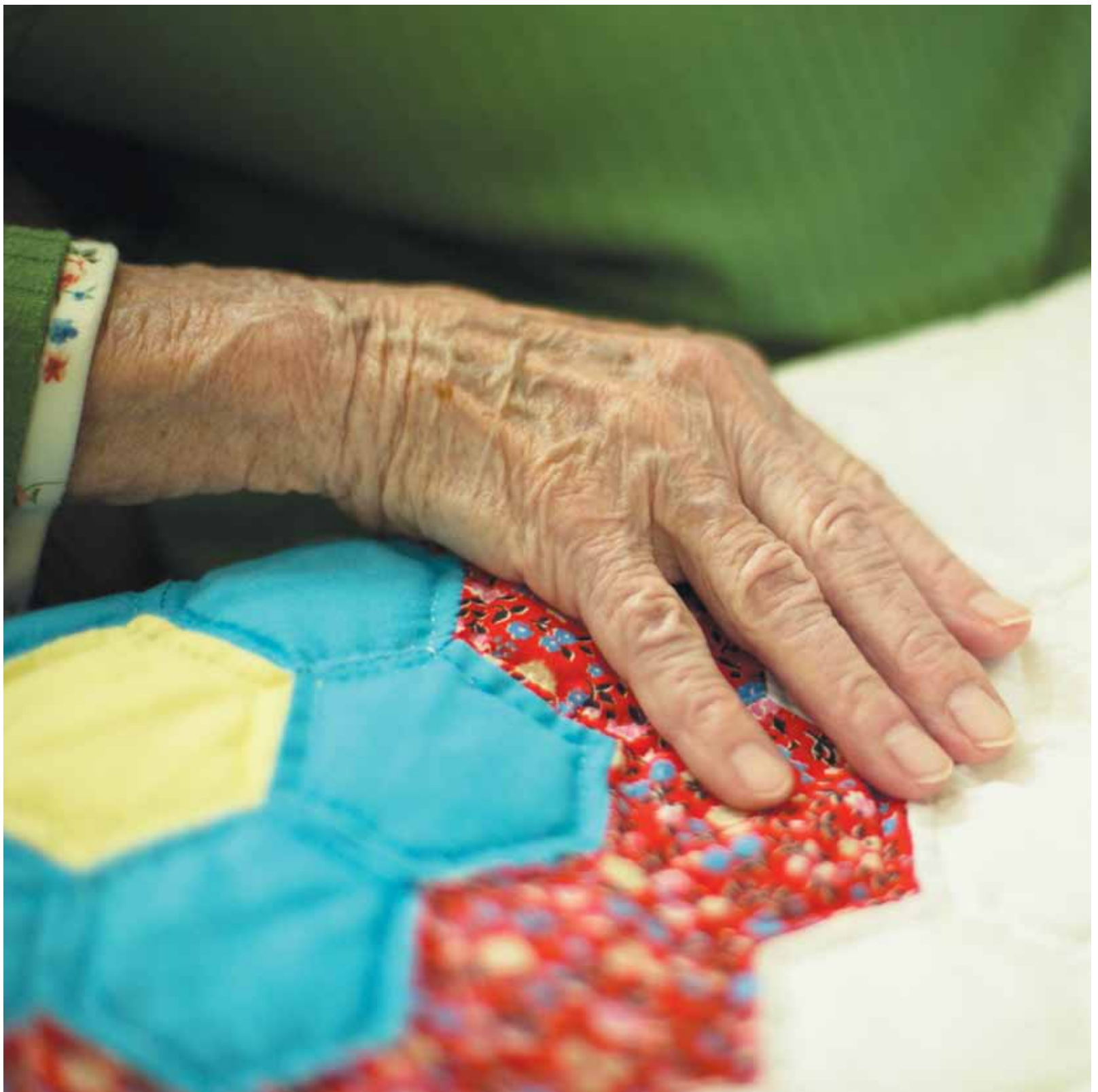
