New funds

Ellis Boury, III Fund Established to advance the education and/or development of creative or technical writing in students or young professionals with special consideration given to those focusing on the promotion of the humanities, specifically addressing tolerance, social introspection and responsibility.

- The Mt. Hebron Cemetery Fund Established by Trustees L. Carl Harr, David Lesher, Richard Allman, and Thomas Allman, to provide perpetual support for Mt. Hebron Cemetery (*aka* Cortland Cemetery) located in the heart of Canaan Valley. A portion of the income generated from the fund will be reinvested for continued growth; the remainder will provide an annual grant for the maintenance, historic preservation, and beautification of the cemetery.
- **Davis Health System Foundation Fund** In 2011-12, after a successful fundraising campaign and with tremendous support from the community at-large, the Davis Health System Foundation (DHSF) created a guest house for patients of the Cancer Care Center on the campus of Davis Medical Center in Randolph County. Since that time, the house has been utilized extensively by patients and families who travel from all over the region and beyond. To insure ongoing operations, DHSF board members established an endowment to maximize the return on invested funds. With a goal of growing the fund to \$350,000, the endowment should fund the operating costs of the Davis House in perpetuity.

Shaffer Senior Citizen Fund* Created by the estate of Harold W. & Ruth F. Shaffer to provide perpetual funding for the Tucker County Senior Citizens Center.

Shaffer Parsons Volunteer Fire Department Fund* Created by the estate of Harold and Ruth Shaffer to provide perpetual support for the Parsons Volunteer Fire Department.

- Knights of Pythias Brown Lodge #32 Fund Members of the organization ceased operations in the spring of 2014 and decided to continue their legacy of helping youth by establishing a scholarship fund to benefit Preston County High School seniors. Scholarships will be awarded annually based on a competitive application process.
- Harsh Cemetery Fund Located along Clover Run Road in Tucker County, this fund was seeded with donations from family members to provide perpetual support for the cemetery. The fund must reach \$10,000, the minimum fund requirement for cemetery preservation funds, before it will generate annual grants. Endowed funds have five years to reach the minimum funding requirement.

*In 1997, Harold and Ruth Shaffer also established the Shaffer Mountain Hospice Fund and the Harold W. & Ruth F. Shaffer Scholarship Fund.

Endowments can be established with cash and other assets. Options for creating a fund include estate planning, giving circles, memorial donations, and *Run For It*. Preston Meets Challenge

The **Preston Community Fund** is the first of its kind for Tucker Community Foundation. Designed to benefit a specific geographic area, the Area Fund was established on a 1:1 match challenge by TCF. Mid way through the challenge, an anonymous donor stepped up with a 1:1 challenge that TCF also agreed to match, resulting in a 3:1 match challenge and yielding quick results. The fund reached its minimum fund requirement after a successful *Run For It* campaign led by a team of *Preston Community Fund Runners*. The fund will provide unrestricted grant and scholarship awards for Preston County based on recommendations from a committee of Preston County residents and select donors.







Shell Wind Energy, in addition to their substantial race sponsor donation, provided a dedicated EMS crew on race day.



The Climb Continues...Boulder Park Updates

- A Tucker County Parks and Recreation grant for \$2,500 was awarded for park benches.
- The Town of Davis received a \$5,000 TCF grant to leverage additional grant support for the project.
- A \$150,000 West Virginia Recreational Trail grant for park and trail development is pending. The grant requires an 80/20 match. If funded, the Heart of the Highlands will construct the trail connector to satisfy the match requirement.



• A \$120,000 National Park Service Land and Water Conservation Fund grant to install the large boulder was submitted to the state office for review. The grant requires a 50/50 match and, thanks to many generous donors, that requirement has been met.

• Eric Thompson's *TuckerCo-OnTheGo* project connected us with representatives from Paradox Sports who will work with the Boulder Park design team to include adaptive climbing features to increase accessibility for challenged athletes.





His Legacy Lives On
